Mission The Nuclear Society of Slovenia (NSS) is a volunteer association of scientists, professionals and people of other disciplines working or interested in the field of peaceful use of nuclear science and technology.

> Activities of the Society are based on principles of knowledge dissemination, peaceful use of nuclear technology and environmental protection. Any Slovenian citizen who is working or interested in the field of nuclear science and technology can become a member of the Nuclear Society of Slovenia.

Main scope and goals of the Society

- Managing objective public information regarding professional issues and the promotion of the peaceful use of nuclear science and technology.
- Maintenance of high calibre professional and expert activities, promotion of information exchange and the transfer of knowledge from technology to national industry.
- Co-operation for setting standards and surveys of Slovenian legislation in the field of nuclear science and technology
- Support for the safe operation of nuclear facilities in the Republic of Slovenia and active participation in solving specific technical problems.
- Support for publishing literature and systematic work toward creating Slovenian terminology in the field of nuclear science and technology.
- Co-operation with similar associations and expert organisations, organising expert meetings and consultancies, and encouraging expert training, research grants and the exchange of professionals at home and abroad.

Achievements of the Society

The main achievements of the Society are the organisation of the traditional conference "Nuclear Energy for New Europe", held every September, and the organisation of various expert lectures and study tours on the subjects of nuclear technology and legislation. Among publishing achievements are the English-Slovene Glossary of Nuclear technology, the Atlas of Nuclear Technology, and the regular newsletter "Jedrce" (Nucleus).

The Society collaborates with many institutions at home and abroad and is part of the European Nuclear Society - ENS.

Organisation of the Society:

The Assembly is the highest body in the Society consisting of all its members. The president of the Society, in accordance with the Board of Directors, summons regular assemblies at least once per year.

The president represents and acts on behalf of the Society before government bodies, before other organisations at home and abroad, and before third various parties. The president is responsible for the lawful work of the Society in accordance with its Statute. The president bears responsibility against the Assembly.

The Board of Directors (BOD) is an executive body of the Assembly that performs organisational, professional and expert functions, and runs the Society in the period between two Assembly sittings following the procedures set in the program and resolutions adopted by the Assembly.

The Supervisory Committee (SC) surveys work for the BOD and other bodies of the Society, and supervises and controls the financial and material operations of the Society. The SC reports to the Assembly on its work at least once per year.

The Society has two sections:


- Young Generation Network YGN
- Alpha Section.

Young Generation Network

Network Young Generation Network (YGN) is a group of present and future professionals, who, because of their youth pay special attention to questions about science, environment, progress and the future for themselves and the world in general.

YGN stands for the support of youth creativity, strengthening their capabilities, such as the excellence of their global knowledge and technological progress in the nuclear field. YGN promotes information and education of young scientists, engineers, technicians and trained personnel in all nuclear disciplines, where it strives for a harmonised transfer of knowledge to reject the needs of youths and industry, respectively. YGN encourages its members to present their ideas and helps them achieve their fulfilment.

YGN is actively involved in the work of the Society with aims of organising presentations of the Society at various fair shows, of organising expert guidance on exhibitions, of informing and advising students on issues related to nuclear technology and identifying options for further education and employment. YGN organises round tables, study tours, etc.; and for many years it hosts a volleyball tournament and final barbecue party.



Alpha Section

Section Alpha Section was established to fulfil a need to inform the public on nuclear and radiation activities, where women are involved. The Alpha Section is designated to exchange information within the Section, to organise social gatherings, to link professions within the section and to support women in the field of nuclear science and technology used for peaceful purposes. The Alpha Section also supports the connection and co-operation of sections within the Society, as well as similar associations at home and abroad.

The Alpha Section is actively involved in the work of the Society with an aim of organising lectures for the general public in the field of nuclear and radiation activities with experts from Slovenia and abroad, of organising social activities within the Society, of regularly informing and reporting in the Nucleus and of co-operating in the Society's different activities. Alpha Section is also a member of the world organisation, Women in Nuclear Global and co-operates with the informal association of Slovene female physicists.
